- Japan, as a responsible global participant in the international community as well as a member of the G7 group, will actively be engaged in and support Ukraine in stability.
- In order to support Ukraine's efforts toward stabilization and reforms, it is important to (1) improve the economic situation, (2) restore democracy, and (3) encourage a nation-wide dialogue for national integrity.
- Japan announced assistance amounting to approximately <u>USD 1.86 billion</u> the largest by country, steadily ongoing.
