Development issue 1-1 Improvement of Economic and Investment Environment	<p>[Background and current situation] Despite the promotion of a market economy, Ukraine is facing such difficulties as both fiscal and current account deficits, low foreign exchange reserves and increasing geopolitical risks. Due to the continuing conflict in the eastern regions, its economy has been stagnating, having shown negative growth in 2014 and 2015. In 2019, the growth rate remained at around 3.2% only, even after the gradual shift to positive growth. Moreover, in the energy sector, since the supply of natural gas and coal is unstable due to the deteriorated relations with Russia and the conflict in eastern Ukraine, the introduction of energy efficiency technologies, promotion of the renewable energy, and development of domestic gas fields remain critical for the country.</p>				<p>[Strategy] For Ukraine to break out from its sluggish economic situation and ensure its sustainable economic development, Japan provides financial assistance and supports for the development of economic infrastructure. Furthermore in order to ensure the fiscal consolidation of Ukraine, Japan transfers its technologies using best practices and provides support for development of human resources. Since the instability of the energy and electricity sectors hinders the further development of industry and investment, support is provided mainly to the ministries and public executing agencies which are responsible for building the foundation. Under this strategy, Japan will contribute to Goal 7 (Affordable and Clean Energy), Goal 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure), Goal 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).</p>

It is crucial for Ukraine to implement bold and comprehensive reforms to overcome this challenge. In order to promote such efforts, Japan continues to support Ukraine in different ways, including the G7 Ambassadors' Support Group in Ukraine framework.</p>			<p>[Strategy] Japan supports the further promotion of institutional reform of the Ukrainian government through capacity building for legislative and administrative agencies and sharing Japan's experience and knowledge in governance, anti-corruption training, enhancement in the operational and maintenance capacity of neutral and fair public broadcasting with the aim of preventing fraud and corruption. Under this strategy, Japan will contribute notably to Goal 5(Gender Equality), Goal 9(Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure), Goal 16(Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions), 17(Partnerships for the Goals) of SDGs.</p>

Priority Area 3-2 Promotion of Internal Reconciliation	<p>[Background and current situation] As a result of sporadic clashes between the Ukrainian Armed Forces and the pro-Russian troops in eastern Ukraine that put local residents at risk of shelling, more internally displaced people, including socially vulnerable groups of people such as women and children, have emerged. The need for humanitarian assistance for those people, as well as the reconstruction of local social infrastructure is still high even after 6 years of the conflict.</p>			<p>[Strategy] Japan supports humanitarian and infrastructure restoration through international organisations in order to improve the humanitarian situation around the eastern region. Under this strategy, Japan will contribute to Goal 1 (No Poverty), Goal 3 (Good Health and Well-being), Goal 4 (Quality Education), and Goal 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institution) of the SDGs.</p>
